In 2023, Keep Louisiana Beautiful conducted a roadway litter survey which documented an astounding 143 million pieces of litter on interstates and highways in Louisiana. Tobacco products and beverage containers were the most prevalent type of litter. Litter is harmful to wildlife and poses a danger to our residents. Litter creates potential road hazards and can clog drainage systems, which contributes to flooding. Over \$91 million a year is spent in Louisiana on litter cleanup and prevention efforts.
